Re: AUMPathway agreement between **Cybercrime Investigation and Enforcement Major (CIE)** and the Master of Arts in Criminal Justice

Pursuant to Graduate Regulations related to Accelerated Undergraduate to Master's Pathway (AUMP) (G-8), the Masters of Arts in Criminal Justice (MACJ) and the Criminal Justice Major establish the following agreement to allow students to accelerate their attainment of the MACJ by beginning master's level coursework during their undergraduate career.

The **Cybercrime Investigation and Enforcement Major** agrees to accept and apply up to 16 credits of graduate coursework from the Criminal Justice Master's degree program toward courses in **Cybercrime Investigation and Enforcement Major**.

Courses

AUMP students may substitute (courses will fit in electives category under the major):

- CJ 612 for CJ 327
- CJ 653 for CJ 453
- CJ 660 for CJ 450
- CJ 536 for CJ 436
- CJ 551 for CJ 451
- CJ 545 for CJ 445

CJ open electives

AUMP students may also enroll in any other available 500 or 600-level CJ elective.

The MACJ agrees to allow students who meet the university's qualification for the AUMP to enroll in up to 16 credits of CJ courses that will count towards completion of the MACJ.
