

Health and Wellness Center Advisory Committee

Minutes from Friday, February 24, 2012 meeting at
4:00pm-5:00pm

Introductions were conducted. Members in attendance: Danielle Kermode, Mitchell Newton, Lacey Collins, Rob Troyer, Heidi Guy and Rip Horsey.

A motion to approve the minutes was brought to the committee by Mitchell; a second from Rob, approved by vote of 4-0-1.

A meeting schedule was discussed for March 9th and 4-5pm. Rob will be unavailable for the March 9th meeting. Future meeting to occur in spring 2012 term Rip will send out a when to meet request.

The HWC membership rates of \$78 per term were discussed regarding IFC's decision to approve the HWC's budget which would increase the membership rate to \$87 per term. A point was made the increase could possibly have individuals not join/renew memberships due to the increase, currently there are only 125 WOU Community members. After further discussion a consensus developed; in the opinion of the committee the rates should stay the same for WOU Community members.

The HWC's membership access was discussed regarding the request of the Polk County Fire Department to become members of the HWC. A point was made that this may open up a new can of worms. Another point was made that there are other workout facilities in the community and the only areas not present in the surrounding community was the Aquatic Center and Climbing Wall. It was decided to table the access issue before seeing if the PCFD is just looking for training on the Climbing Wall and Aquatic Center as rentals.

Emeritus and Retired Faculty/Staff memberships were discussed and an agreement was made to ask the Business Manager for WOU more question regarding the acceptance of a limited number of per term memberships.

Alumni memberships were discussed and a consensus decision was made that this group would still have no access to HWC memberships.

There were no last minute items.

A motion to adjourn was brought to the committee by Mitchell; a second from Lacey, approved by a vote of 4-0-1.
