Position Summary:

The Sports Specialists are responsible for providing a welcoming, inclusive and safe atmosphere for WOU's Intramural and Club Sports programs. The Sports Specialist is also responsible for helping maintain a clean and safe atmosphere at the Campus Recreation Turf Field. Sports Specialists must be able to implement Campus Recreation policies and playing rules in order to maintain an appropriate level of control, fairness, and safety in all our sports programs and facilities. They should maintain a positive attitude on-site and should always be striving to improve their communication, conflict resolution, and customer service skills.

Specific Duties/ Expectations of the Position:

- Preparation and inspection of the facilities used for Intramural and Club Sports events, including the set-up and tear-down of equipment and removal of safety hazards
- Provide gameday management & policy enforcement during Intramural events and club sport home games
- Assist with the check-in and monitoring of club sport practices to ensure compliance with safety policies and procedures
- Perform a variety of administrative duties including preparing check-in paperwork and inputting game schedules results
- Officiate Intramural contests with an emphasis on maintaining a safe environment for all participants
- May assist with the promotion/marketing of Club & Intramural Sports to the WOU community
- Other duties as assigned

Requirements of the Position (minimum and preferred):

- Must be a student enrolled at WOU (M)
- Ability to work evenings and weekends (M)
- Ability, or willingness to learn how to officiate multiple Intramural Sports (M)
- CPR/First Aid Certification (P)
- Previous sports officiating and customer service experience (P)
- Knowledge of game and rules and Intramural policies (P)

Working Conditions:

- Ability to lift 45 pounds regularly and 100 to 150 pounds occasionally; ability to walk and stand for extended periods of time

- Ability to bend, stoop, kneel, stretch and reach constantly
- Ability to work in various/inclement weather conditions
