About Western Oregon University:

Western Oregon University is a regional public, mid-sized university – committed to changing lives, strengthening communities and transforming our world. Located in Monmouth, the heart of Oregon's lush Willamette Valley, WOU is about 20 minutes from Salem, the state's capital and about 75 minutes from Portland, the state's cultural hub.

Western is one of Oregon's oldest public institutions of higher education and was incorporated into the state system as a teacher training institution in 1882. The university offers undergraduate and graduate degrees in arts and sciences, education and professional areas. It's known for small class sizes, a focus on sustainability and a diverse liberal arts education in a student-centered environment. Western is an emerging Hispanic Serving institution, with over 40% of undergraduates being students of color.

Position Summary:

The Division of Health & Exercise Science (HEXS) in the College of Education at Western Oregon University invites applications for one (1) full-time instructional faculty position with primary responsibilities in coordination, supervision, and assessment of required components of the Public Health (PH), and Exercise Science (EXS) Internships for both graduate and undergraduate majors. Additional responsibilities may require teaching academic courses, advising public health and exercise science students, and serving Western Oregon University and the community.

Responsibilities:

- Contact potential site supervisors to establish new internship sites. Foster and support
 established relationships with existing site supervisors. Establish and maintain affiliation
 agreements between the internship/practicum sites and university.
- Conduct informational and advanced planning sessions with undergraduate students at least two terms prior to their internship and at least three to four weeks prior to a practicum. Conduct informational and advanced planning sessions with graduate students prior to their internship/practicum.
- Provide individual students direction and assistance in securing internship/practicum placements. Maintain up-to-date on-boarding processes and assist with onboarding process as needed.
- Monitor current students during their internship/practicum placement.
- Collect data regarding internship/practicums and compile annual assessment reports.
- Teach undergraduate level classes in various formats (e.g., in-person, online, hybrid, synchronous, asynchronous) with possible opportunities for summer, on/off campus teaching
- Collaborate in the growth of the division

- Complete a required WOU online training course for effective online and hybrid instructional practices prior to the start of teaching or simultaneously during the first term of teaching.
- Continue to grow and develop as an educator and as a member of their profession through formal and/or informal activities

- Evidence of at least two years of successful higher education teaching experience in Public Health or closely related field
- Have expertise in two or more of the following areas: community and public health; health and human services; chronic and/or infectious diseases; bioethics and public health; and foundations of health promotion and disease prevention
- Strong evidence of the following: professional communication; work independently and with initiative; teamwork and adaptability, and professional conduct in interactions, including confidentiality
