ACCESS

- What does the Office of Disability Services do?
- Who does ODS serve?
- Federal laws provide framework for ODS such as the Americans with Disabilities Act, the ADA and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973



ACCESS, HOW WE COMPARE

- Other universities approach for student fee funded areas:
The individual area would be responsible for funding any accommodations needs. This approach can lead to individuals feeling like a burden for those requesting access

WOU approach

- Access is allocated funding to address accommodation needs for all areas who receive IFC funding. This approach can lead to a more inclusive experience for those requesting access.



ACCESS

- Funding required to ensure IFC funded areas are accessible to people with disabilities
- ODS provides accommodations, upon request
- IFC funding usage:
 - Any funds not used for accommodations in the FY 21 will be returned to the IFC reserve
 - Unexpected increase in accommodations requests beyond the projected amount, will need to be funded by the IFC reserve
