Why this Enhancement?

<u>Oregon House Bill 2835</u> requires public universities to have a "Benefits Navigator" to assist students with accessing benefits programs

The Higher Education Coordinating Commission has funded this for the past 4 years

Funds:

- Basic Needs Coordinator
- Food Pantry/Stitch Closet supplies
- Student employees
- Outreach/educational programs
- Some emergency financial assistance to students

Why this Enhancement?

This funding is no longer included in the next biennium of the Governor's budget. This may change as it goes through the legislative session, but we won't know the final budget until the session ends.

This means that we need to find other funding sources. Our options are:

- University General Fund
- IFC
- Other grants

We are requesting funding from IFC for the student employees, to ensure the Food Pantry and Stitch Closet remain open and accessible to students and the community.
