QUESADILLA SALVADOREÑA • 3/4 cup sour cream

Ingredients:

- 3 eggs, separated
 - 1 cup white sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking power 1 cup rice flour
- 1/2 cup butter, melted
 1 tablespoon sesame seeds, or to taste
- 1 (4 ounce) package Parmesan cheese, finely grated

How to make:

- 1.Preheat oven to 350 degrees F
- 2.Beat egg whites in a glass, mental, or ceramic bowl until firm, but not stiff
- 3. Combine sugar and butter in a large bowl; beat with an eletric mixer on high speed until creamy. Mix in egg yolks until well blended. Mix in Parmesan cheese gradually. Add sour cream and baking power; beat until batter is smooth.
- 4. Stift rice flour over batter; fold in with a spatula. Fold in egg whites with the spatula.
- 5. Pour batter into a 9x13-inch glass baking dish. Sprinkle sesame seeds on top
- 6.Bake in the pre heated oven until golden brown on top and a toothpick insterted into the center comes out clean, about 38 minutes
