



Supporting students' success *outside* the classroom to ensure their physical/emotional safety

Academic Support Resourcess



Student Success & Advising Office



- Course selection advising for first-year students who don't have an advisor yet, as well as exploratory, pre-nursing, and interdisciplinary students
- Support for students experiencing academic challenges (i.e. academic warning, academic probation, etc.)
- Free peer tutoring for various intro-level and general education courses
- Free peer coaching for study strategies, note-taking, time management, and test-taking support

Other Academic

- Writing Center: Free support for all stages of writing for students (planning, first draft, final draft edits, citing sources/references, etc.)
 - o Located in the Hamersly Library, available for appointments in person or via Zoom
- Computer Science Tutoring: Free support with upper and lower Computer Science courses
 - Located on the 3rd floor of the ITC building
- Math Center: Free drop-in tutoring in English and Spanish for general ed math courses,
 STEM courses, math education classes, honors classes, etc.
 - Located on the 2nd floor of the SSC building
- Plus encourage students to utilize professors' office hours!
- Hamersly Library also allows students to rent technology at no cost for the term/year!

Disability Access Services (DAS) Office



- Provides individualized, reasonable accommodations for WOU students to ensure there is
 equitable access to the community and its programs. Students work directly with DAS and
 they choose when/how to share with professors, if they choose (self-disclosure only).
- Some examples of accommodations:
 - Note-taking support
 - Testing support (extended time, alternative environments)
 - Alternative format for materials
 - Deaf and Hard of Hearing services (interpreting, transcribing, captioning)
 - Accessible classroom environment
- Plus a resource for staff/faculty for support with accessible programming/materials!

TRiO Programs for WOU Students



Student Enrichment Program (SEP)

- SEP supports students who meet any of the following criteria:
 - First-generation students
 - Underrepresented financial backgrounds
 - Eligible to receive services from DAS
- Holistic + individualized advising, workshops/seminars to support students' success, tuition free FYS courses, close community, and more

Teacher Prep Student Support Services (TP-SSS)

- TP-SSS supports education-track students
- Academic advising, financial literacy support, free FYS classes, teacher licensure examsupport, close community, and more

Troubleshooting Hold

- Most common holds on student accounts that prevent registration:
 - Accounts Receivable hold: Past due balance or incomplete Revolving Charge Form, will need to contact <u>businessoffice@wou.edu</u>.
 - **Transcript hold / Enrollment Fee holds:** Admissions Office is missing transcript and/or enrollment fee from student; student will need to contact admissions@wou.edu.
 - **Medical Withdrawal (VPSA) hold:** Student has taken a medical withdrawal through the VPSA and has not provided documentation to return. Contact studentaffairs@wou.edu.
 - Judicial hold: Student has not completed sanctions from Student Conduct, student will need to contact <u>studentconduct@wou.edu</u>.
 - Medical hold: Student is not in compliance with immunization requirements, contact health@wou.edu.
 - Advising hold / Academic Standing hold: Student will need to contact advising@wou.edu.
 - Student Affairs hold: Student has not completed required bystander intervention training and/or anti-hazing training. Contact studentaffairs@wou.edu.

Basic Needs & Safetty Resourcess



Student Health & Counseling (SHCC) Office



- Provides free (or low-cost options) medical and counseling services to students,
 in-person or via telehealth, paid for by students' Health Fee (\$136 or \$183/term) -
 - Individual and/or group counseling
 - Acute illness/injury care
 - Chronic condition management
 - STI testing, menstrual health, pregnancy-related support
 - o Physicals, lab work, immunizations, etc.
- SHCC also offers same-day crisis services (drop in or can call)
 - Students can go by themselves or you can walk with them to the SHCC office to help them request a crisis appointment

Abby's House

- Provides campus community with resources, education opportunities, and referrals to promote equity and non-violence.
- Basic Needs Coordinator, Maria Barrera, can meet with students to assist with accessing basic needs resources such as food, transportation, clothing, toiletries, menstrual products, etc.
 - Trauma-informed approach and can connect with external resources too
- Confidential advocates can meet with students who have experienced interpersonal and/or domestic violence without being required to report (*not* mandated reporters) so students can explore options, talk about their experience, and feel supported.
 - Including financial support for DV survivors needing housing assistance

Other Basic Needs

Stitch Closet & Food Pantry <u>esour</u> <u>e</u>

- - Clothes are donated, ensured to be in good condition, and washed/folded
 - o Grocery items are stored safely, regularly checked for quality, and there are a wide variety of dietary needs
 - Located in the Welcome Center

Emergency Student Aid

• Financial support for students who are experiencing crisis/emergency situation that has affected their wellbeing. Housed within the VPSA office, reviewed by a committee, and funded by WOU Foundation funds.



WOLF Ride Program

- Provides free rides for WOU students during operating hours within the Monmouth-Independence area to ensure safe transportation.
 - Funded through IFC funds, overseen by VPSA office
- Typical operating hours are in the evenings, with some day-time hours during the week and over weekend.
 - Will reopen at beginning of Fall term
- Students can request rides via app and/or by texting or calling the WOLF Ride cell number. Staffed by student drivers who have completed driver authorization and training.
- Van is also available to rent for departmental/group use!

Accountability/Support

Student Conduct Office

- Supports students to take responsibility for actions, provide fair/impartial process for students, and ensure a safe environment for entire campus community
- Upholds <u>Code of Student Responsibility</u> & provides educational programming

CARE Team

 Committee of staff members across campus; purpose is to assess, discuss, and recommend intervention regarding significant campus issues

Campus Public Safety

 24/7 support for students, staff, faculty to ensure safety. After-hours resource for student emergencies, as well as reporting safety concerns

Reporting Resources

Student of Concern Form

- Used to report any situation where you are concerned about a student's mental/physical well-being, inappropriate behavior, and/or access to basic needs
- Reviewed and handled appropriately by CARE Team
- Open to students, staff, faculty, and community members to fill out

Campus Concerns and Misconduct Report Form

- Used to report incidents involving sexual harassment/assault, violence, stalking, retaliation, bias, discrimination, harassment, etc.
- Depending on content, this is forwarded to appropriate office

For BOTH forms: Staff/faculty (including student employees) cannot stay anonymous, per mandated reporter policies. Community members and non-employed students can remain anonymous. Both are available on our Student Affairs website!

Personall Growth & Belonging Resourcess



Center for Professional Pathways (CPP) Office



- Provides career-readiness support to both students and alumni
 - Resume and cover letter support
 - Interview skills
 - One-on-one coaching
 - Job fairs and networking events
 - o Internships (including paid internships) and volunteer opportunities
 - Support with finding on-campus and off-campus jobs
- Can help departments find student employees for open positions



Located on the 2nd floor of the SSC building

Student Engagement

- Provides campus activities and leadership development opportunities for students
 - Oversees Fraternity/Sorority life, Student Activities Board, Western Howl, ASWOU, and several student clubs/organizations (available to view on Involve)
 - Events include:
 - Homecoming Week
 - Holiday Tree Lighting
 - Celebration of Black Graduates
 - Prep Week activities
 - And more!

Identity & Cultural Belonging

Multicultural Student Services & Programs (MSSP) Office

- Supports recruitment, retention, and success of historically underrepresented students
 - o Personal guidance, academic advising, mentoring, advocacy support
 - Cultural and social campus activities
 - Multicultural Student Union (MSU) club
 - Diversity Scholars Program
 - Student recognition and graduation celebrations

Stonewall Center




Veterans Resource Center (VRC)
