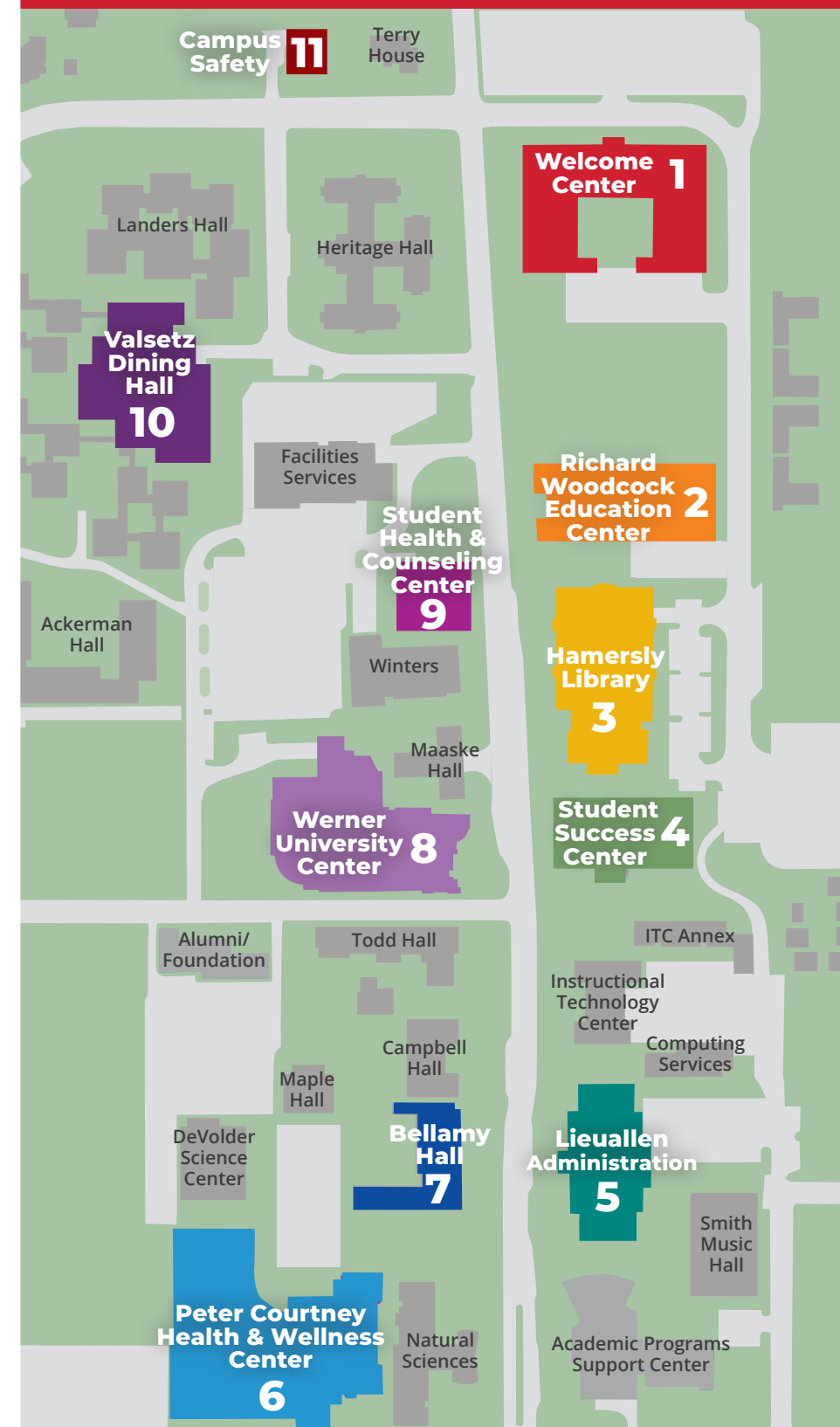

DAS serves students with documented disabilities who experience access barriers related to their disability impacts. We also work with other students on short-term accommodations for short-term disability impacts.

We approve and coordinate reasonable accommodations —on a case-by-case basis—to provide equal access to programs, classes, and services. Common disability-related accommodations may include alternative testing arrangements, alternative format reading materials, and more.

Student Enrichment Program (SEP)

SEP is a federally-funded TRIO program that helps students who are first-generation (neither parent has completed a bachelor's degree), come from underrepresented financial backgrounds, or are eligible to receive services through WOU Disability Access Services. SEP helps students overcome barriers to higher education and achieve their academic goals by offering free academic support services including:

- Holistic advising
- Workshops and seminars focused on academic success, time management, financial literacy, study skills, stress management, graduation requirements, internship opportunities and preparation for graduate programs
- Tuition free First-Year Seminar Gen Ed Courses
- Access to the laptops and free printing in the TRIO/First Gen Center
- Chromebooks available for checkout

SSA provides academic resources and support to all students at WOU. We are the primary advisors for pre-nursing and exploratory students (students exploring major options), but also provide support to students experiencing academic challenges and transfer students transitioning to WOU.

SSA also coordinates free peer tutoring services for introductory and core major and general education courses (excluding Mathematics, Writing, and Computer Science) as well as peer academic coaching for study strategies, note-taking, time management, and test-taking.
